Parents Evening

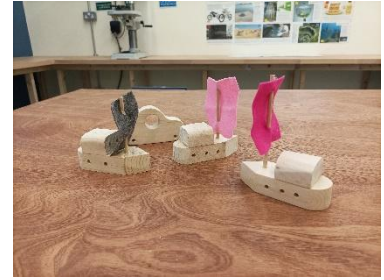
