## **Brentry Bulletin**

#### **WOW Enrichment Activities**

It's been another busy term here at Brentry. Our weekly WOW enrichment sessions have afforded our pupils opportunities to excel in the kitchen, on the sport's court and with a range of hobby based and gaming activities. The pupils have also worked hard to earn the points for our off-site trips this term that included Ninja Warrior and virtual reality experiences! This impressive work ethic was also on display in the run up to world book day which saw pupils pushing to develop their reading skills as part of our reading competition. We were also joined by a powerful Knife crime prevention workshop. The level of respect and engagement demonstrated by our pupils during the session was commendable.





#### **PSHE**

This term in PHSE we have been looking at healthy relationships. We have compared differences between healthy and unhealthy relationships, and have identified some green and red flags to look out for. We also looked at setting personal boundaries and how it is important to set boundaries for a healthy relationship.

## **English**

In English pupils enjoyed exploring the dystopian genre. We analysed a range of seminal texts such as The Hunger Games and 1984 before moving on to produce our own dystopian narratives. The resulting texts have been rooted in a firm understanding of genre and included some immersive settings, ambitious vocabulary and well-defined characters.

#### Art

In Art this term we have been studying Building and Structures and many learners have gained their AQA award in perspective drawing as part of this work. The attention to detail





in drawing some of our nation's most iconic buildings and structures has been extremely impressive!

#### **ICT**

In Computing we have been learning all about some of the Pioneers of Computing including such diverse characters as Alan Turing, Katherine Jackson, Grace Hopper and Sir Tim Berners-Lee.

#### DT

Pupils made great use of the DT facilities and have been creating wooden boxes using corner lap joints. This has required precise work with saws and chisels as well as a lot of sanding! There have been some excellent pieces of work that pupils have spent considerable time, skill and care making. Some have been converted into jewellery boxes, playing card containers and even a goldfinch nesting box for inside an aviary.



#### **Maths**

In maths this term the focus has been on algebra. A number of pupils have discovered that instead of being fearful of trying algebra, they can actually do it quite well! By the end of term, all pupils have completed end of topic tests that demonstrated they could write and simplify expressions, substitute into formulas and solve 2-step equations.

Wessex Water also provide opportunities for their apprentices to learn to drive.


## Boxing
